A rhapsody is a piece of art that has no formal structure and expresses powerful feelings. It is extremally emotional.

With in the context of the design of a senior independent living suite, the sunset plays an important role in the transition from work to rest just as this this senior period of life is marked as a transition from work to retirement. The night time symbolizes the cooling down of the hot day and entering into a time of reservation, restoration, and relaxation.



REFUGE

The home provides a sense of refuge from the unknown. This is reflected by the intentional separation of the dark outside and the comfortable, safe interior.

MATERIAL CONNECTION WITH NATURE

A majority of the materials used in construction are of natural origin. The floors are terracotta, the walls are clay/plaster, the trim and ceilings are natural wood, and the tile work is clay.

DYNAMIC & DIFFUSE LIGHT

The interior layout functions to allow light to pass all the way through the space. Several geometric patterns and screens play with this light as at it moves further into the space.

BIOMORPHIC FORMS & PATTERNS

Several patterns with in the interior's finishes symbolize and highlight biomorphic forms, the kitchen window forms a rose and the kitchen and bathroom tile takes its inspiration from floral design.

VISUAL CONNECTION WITH NATURE

In addition to the frequent use of plants throughout the interior, the layout serves to best utilize the light emitted from the setting sun which can be picture framed in the arched living room windows.







