


The intent of this design is to create a jovial, eclectic, and sustainable ranch-style home for the Palmer Family: John, Mary, Lisa (8) and Jimmy (4). This residence is designed in Casper, Wyoming because it is one of the three cleanest cities for levels of particle pollution. This is intentional because Lisa suffers from asthma. Through an open, playful and textural implementation of sustainable building practices and materials along with biophilic concepts, this design is meant to be both eco-conscious and youthful. The circulation of this house is based on the concept of togetherness, where fellowship is the focal point. This translates into the floorplan through the dining table being in the center of the home; you have to pass through it to get to every sector of the home, emphasizing the importance of spending time there.

Quarry tile and reclaimed wood beams, a well water system, upcycled furniture pieces, local + artisanal materials and art, terrazzo, insulated walls, low flow plumbing appliances, low VOC paint, motion sensor lighting, dimmer switches, energy efficient lamps and bamboo hardwoods are all sustainable aspects of this design. The neutral tones, accent stonework vent hood, raw wood grain of the reclaimed beams on the ceilings, optimal daylighting from clerestory windows, an abundance of plant life and an open and sun soaked floor plan all play to the biophilic aspect of this holistic design. The organic textures of stone, the plaster finish on the walls, dappled light from all the low-e glass windows paired with the tonal variation in the reclaimed hardwood trim around the wall openings and the patina of copper in the dining table light makes for a space that speaks to the beauty in aged, reclaimed and natural materials.

All of the biophilic and sustainable characteristics harmoniously meld together in appreciation of the earth we inhabit and together speak to the importance of precious time well spent and resources used responsibly. The goal here is that this home will be a sustainable, rejuvenating space for the Palmer family, where they feel not only connected with nature, but more importantly with each other.
