Introduction

The Georgia Initiative for Community Housing (GICH) is a three-year program that helps communities improve their quality of life and economic vitality through locally driven housing and revitalization strategies. Upon graduation from the program, communities can apply for alumni certification to demonstrate their continued participation in GICH. The Department of Community Affairs (DCA) has designated 21 GICH certified alumni communities in 2024. The purpose of certification is to encourage GICH alumni to continue their efforts of addressing affordable housing issues and shortages within their communities by using the Housing Plan document developed while participating in the program. Certified alumni communities are eligible for additional incentives through DCA's Housing Tax Credit, Community HOME Investment Program, and Community Development Block Grant programs.

Overview of 2023 Alumni Certification Process

This year, 27 GICH alumni communities submitted certification applications with relevant documentation. Each application was evaluated through a standardized scoring process requiring the completion of five key criteria, including:

- 1. Updating their GICH team roster
- 2. Attending GICH retreats in 2022 and 2023
- 3. Having at least four team members attend housing continuing education events (as defined by DCA) in 2022 and 2023.
- 4. Holding at least one team meeting with a majority of active team members in attendance in 2022 and one team meeting in 2023.
- 5. Updating their GICH housing plan within the last three years OR having their updated plan incorporated into a local planning document in the past three years
