PROFILE OF CONTRIBUTIONS TO DEVELOPMENTAL PSYCHOLOGY

Developmental scientist whose program of research examines how adversity becomes biologically and psychologically embedded across childhood and adolescence, and why some young people develop psychopathology and substance-use vulnerability while others demonstrate resilience. The work integrates developmental psychopathology, psychophysiology, neuroimaging, longitudinal methods, and ecological context, with sustained attention to rural, low-income, maltreated, and racially marginalized youth.

A central conceptual contribution is the hormesis model of resilience, which specifies how the effects of stress may vary nonlinearly as a function of dose, developmental timing, mechanism, and environmental context. This framework complements a broader empirical program on child maltreatment, socioeconomic hardship, sleep, emotion regulation, neurocognitive development, and family and community protection.

Selected Indicators of National and Field-Level Impact

Scholarship. More than 140 peer-reviewed publications and 7,700+ citations (Google Scholar, August 2026), including work in Developmental Psychology, Development and Psychopathology, JAMA Network Open, Pediatrics, Translational Psychiatry, Child Maltreatment, and Journal of Research on Adolescence.

Externally funded developmental research. Principal Investigator on two active NIDA R01 awards and a completed NIDA K01 totaling \$7.28 million. Across PI, co-PI, co-investigator, and consultant roles, the awarded external research portfolio totals \$16.95 million.

Scientific and editorial leadership. Founder and Director of the Georgia Center for Developmental Science; Associate Editor of Journal of Research on Adolescence (2018–2025); and editorial contributor across leading developmental, neuroscience, maltreatment, and resilience journals.

Influence, training, and public reach. Invited and keynote presentations at national and international institutions; mentoring of 16 doctoral students, three postdoctoral scholars, and more than 100 undergraduate researchers; and research coverage in TIME, The Washington Post, U.S. News & World Report, and HealthDay.

SCIENTIFIC LEADERSHIP AND FIELD BUILDING

Scientific mission and growth. Founded GCDS in 2024 as a university-wide extension of the Youth Development Institute Lab, developed its scientific mission, recruited senior and affiliated faculty, and expanded collaboration across departments, colleges, and partner institutions.

Shared scientific infrastructure. Oversees MRI neuroimaging, RSA and HRV assessment, cortisol and biospecimen procedures, behavioral paradigms, and data science platforms that support a multi-investigator research community.

Funding and faculty development. Supports affiliated and early-career faculty through team formation, grant development, methods consultation, internal review, and planning toward independent external funding.

Community partnership. Established the Family and Community Engagement team and recruited its initial staff to build sustained partnerships with rural families, schools, service providers, and state agencies across Georgia.

Scientific convening and visibility. Led the inaugural GCDS conference, Pathways of Risk and Resilience, From Neuron to Neighborhood, in April 2026. The meeting brought together more than 100 faculty members, students, distinguished guests, and community participants.

Mentoring and training. Builds shared mentoring structures for doctoral students, postdoctoral scholars, early-career faculty, undergraduate researchers, and summer medical student interns.

MENTORING AND TALENT DEVELOPMENT

Mentoring spans doctoral and postdoctoral training, early-career faculty development, undergraduate research, and cross-institutional summer experiences. The record includes 16 doctoral students as major professor, three postdoctoral scholars, and more than 100 undergraduate researchers, many supported through the Center for Undergraduate Research Opportunities. Through GCDS, early-career faculty receive coordinated support in building independent research programs, interdisciplinary teams, and competitive proposals for external funding.

Undergraduate and Summer Research Training

Undergraduate research. More than 100 undergraduate researchers have participated in the laboratory since 2015, most with CURO support. The Fall 2026 cohort includes 25 students across HDFS, psychology, data science, biology, biomedical physiology, microbiology, and related programs.

Cross-institutional training. The Summer 2026 program included two medical students from the Medical College of Georgia, a Vanderbilt University master’s student, and a McGill University undergraduate, alongside UGA research interns.
