### BROAD RESEARCH INTERESTS AND AIMS

My research aims to advance developmental science and examine resilience by elucidating the multilevel mechanisms and diverse environmental contexts influencing risk behavior development in children and youth. Focused on the complex interplay between chronic psychosocial stressors (such as violence, poverty, and discrimination) and adolescent adjustment, my work seeks to unravel how these factors contribute to health risk behaviors and resilience. Employing a multilevel (from neighborhood to neural level) multimethod (fMRI, psychophysiological, observational, and survey data collection) approach, my objective is to generate empirical insights that can inform effective interventions and policies for fostering positive youth development under adversity.
